Did you know you may be eligible for a tax incentive before the end of the year?

Two of the biggest tax incentives for businesses are Section 179 expensing and bonus depreciation. You may be eligible for both depending on your business's taxable income. These deductions can significantly lower your taxable income, saving you money that can be used to expand your business. In other words, if construction is complete and in-use by the end of the year, up to 100% of the improvement cost may be tax deductible.

From a business standpoint, now might be a good time to replace your old greenhouse or invest in equipment that has declined over the years. Incentives exist that you can take advantage of to repair a structure that has often been overlooked with legitimate tax deductions. Same thing applies when thinking about the tools and equipment that have become essential such as a new conveyor, transplanter, seeder, heaters, blowers, etc.

Whether you are ready to build a new structure or want to refurbish, the tax incentive still applies.
